

## Opportunity & Equality Impact Collective 2023 Grants List

### **Alianza Nacional de Campesinas**

**\$100,000**

Alianza Nacional de Campesinas is the first national farmworker women's organization in the US and is monitoring and reporting the challenges that farmworkers are experiencing (including lack of access to PPE, increased economic stability, lack of childcare, housing, and food insecurity) and sharing this information with communities.

### **Birth Center Equity**

**\$100,000**

Birth Center Equity (BCE) acts as a channel for resources to increase access to community birth center care and create a vibrant, lasting community birth center infrastructure across the country. BCE works with and invests in BIPOC community birth center leaders to grow and sustain BIPOC-led birth centers and provide resources to help pregnant people make informed decisions about how and where they birth.

### **Debt Collective**

**\$100,000**

The Debt Collective is the first debtors union and offers direct services and political education, builds grassroots power, and brings people together to turn their financial burdens into a collective source of leverage for political and economic change.

### **Equal Rights Advocates**

**\$100,000**

Equal Rights Advocates (ERA) advances economic security, workplace justice, fair pay, education equity, and reproductive justice through research, organizing, and policy advocacy. ERA created the Women's Agenda Policy Hub with WDN to connect, support, and provide thousands of resources for advocates, policy influencers, and others eager to transform and influence the legislative process.

### **If/When/How: Lawyering for Reproductive Justice**

**\$100,000**

If/When/How is a national network of legal professionals and movement organizers who are working to make reproductive freedom a reality for all. Their legal defense fund supports people who are exercising their fundamental right to choose.

### **Miscarriage and Abortion Hotline**

**\$100,000**

The Miscarriage and Abortion (M&A) Hotline was founded by two physicians in 2019 to address the surge in online abortion pill orders and increased state laws limiting reproductive access. Over 60 clinician volunteers currently staff the hotline to provide guidance and support callers 18 hours a day, seven days a week.

**National Birth Equity Collaborative****\$100,000**

National Birth Equity Collaborative (NBEC) is one of the nation's leading experts and advocates for change in the Black maternal health and infant mortality crisis. They're shifting systems and culture through training, research, technical assistance, policy, advocacy, and community-centered collaboration to curb mortality rates and create equitable, respectful care for birthing people and their babies.

**National Domestic Workers Alliance for North Carolina Chapter\*†****\$100,000**

National Domestic Workers Alliance, North Carolina Chapter, provides a political home for workers who yearn to acquire the skills to change conditions where they live and work. They connect Black women in different parts of the industry so that they can be powerful together by changing culture and laws.

**National Domestic Workers Alliance for Pennsylvania Chapter\*†****\$100,000**

The Pennsylvania Domestic Workers Alliance builds power, recognition, and respect for over 160,000 domestic workers in Philadelphia, many of whom are undocumented or ineligible for federal relief, through know your rights training and digital organizing.

**Right to the City Alliance****\$100,000**

Right to the City Alliance consists of 70+ community-based racial, economic, gender,

and environmental justice organizations engaged in base building/power-building, capacity building, fiscal sponsorship, and resource redistribution via regranting and policy and advocacy campaigns to protect and expand housing.

**United for a Fair Economy****\$50,000**

United for a Fair Economy uses popular economics education, leadership training, and communications support for social movements to push back against economic inequality and harmful policies in battleground states.

**United for Respect Education Fund****\$100,000**

United for Respect elevates the voices of those employed in the retail economy to call on industry leaders and policymakers to transform jobs so people can lead safe and secure lives. Through online peer networks, they build the leadership of low-paid workers to share their stories and advocate for real solutions.

**We Testify****\$100,000**

We Testify seeks to increase the spectrum of abortion storytellers in the public sphere and shift how the media understands the context and complexity of accessing abortion care.
