# Asian Peoples' Movement on Debt and Development (APMDD)

\$100,000

APMDD is an alliance of over 50 peoples' movements, community organizations, coalitions, and networks focused on economic and climate justice across the Global South. They've recently expanded into Pakistan, India, and Nepal and are bolstering their work organizing and raising awareness for domestic workers in those countries at global convenings, like COP28.

# Center for Embodied Pedagogy and Action (CEPA)

\$50,000

CEPA is a healing justice project working to decolonize Puerto Rico through culture change, community care, land reclamation, and by centering those who have been targeted by capitalism and colonialism.

Their work is rooted in ancestral knowledge and traditional practices, disrupting intergenerational violence, and rematriating land to combat the displacement of Puerto Ricans from their homes.

## Climate Activist Defenders (CAD) \$50,000

CAD protects the lives and wellbeing of frontline climate justice activists working under oppressive and dangerous conditions. Formed in 2019, CAD originally provided emergency relief support to climate activists worldwide who were arrested for protesting. CAD continues to provide safety resources and is strengthening its network within the Climate Justice Movement to make available resources more accessible to activists.

### Climate Justice Alliance (CJA)

\$100,000

CJA promotes community resilience, economic equity, and climate stability by creating new jobs, paying fair salaries, and putting workers formerly employed by extreme energy industries to work in ecosystems that reduce pollution and cost. Using its platform and coalition of 80 partner organizations, CJA also engages in issue-based messaging and civic engagement to shift power at the ballot box.

# Cooperative Food Empowerment Directive (CoFED)

\$50,000

CoFED is a Queer, Trans, Black,
Indigenous, and People of Color-led
(QTBIPOC-led) organization using
education, policy and culture change, and
economic/capacity support for young
leaders building food and land
cooperatives. CoFED also regrants funds to
support QTBIPOC-led co-ops' and farmers'
operations, internal capacity, and efforts to

transform food systems in their communities.

# Corporate Accountability & Public Participation Africa (CAPPA) \$100.000

CAPPA works to advance human rights, challenge corporate abuse of natural resources, and build community power. Their Make Big Polluters Pay campaign launched a liability roadmap as a tool for policymakers to hold big polluters accountable for the harm caused to people and the planet.

#### **Ekvn-Yefolecv**

\$25,000

Ekvn-Yefolecv (ee-gun yee-full-lee-juh) is an ecovillage community of Indigenous Maskoke persons who have returned to their homelands to practice linguistic, cultural, and ecological sustainability.

## Fund for Frontline Power (F4FP) \$135,000

F4FP's decision-making body of 13 grassroots leaders develops strategies to fund grassroots-led climate solutions while sharing their visions, priorities, and practices for movement-led philanthropy. Their "solidarity philanthropy" model centers those most heavily impacted by climate change, enabling them to control the agenda and the purse strings while donors contribute financial and other forms of support.

## Global Campaign to Demand Climate Justice (DCJ)

\$100,000

The Global Campaign to Demand Climate Justice (DCJ) brings together over 200 people's movements and organizations worldwide, primarily in the Global South. DCJ mobilizes grassroots organizations on the frontlines of the climate crisis and international groups as allies, ensuring that people's collective voices are heard in halls of power and streets worldwide.

#### Maui Just Recovery Fund

\$100.000

The Maui Just Recovery Fund supports immediate relief efforts to house, feed and support displaced families and dedicates resources towards long-term efforts to rebuild and advance structural change, including advocating for accountable FEMA, federal, and state support, actively opposing disaster capitalists who may seek to exploit the situation, building back more robust and equitable institutions, and working to ensure that elected officials are accountable to local people, not opportunistic special interests.

# National Black Food and Justice Alliance (NBFJA)

\$25,000

The National Black Food and Justice Alliance (NBFJA) represents hundreds of Black urban and rural farmers, organizers, and land stewards nationwide. They are working towards an intergenerational, urban/rural movement to map, assess, train, and deepen organizing and advocacy

work protecting Black land and work towards food sovereignty.

#### New Economy Coalition for Black Solidarity Economy Fund (BSEF) \$100,000

The Black Solidarity Economy Fund (BSEF) distributes resources to Black-led climate justice organizations nationwide, building the solidarity economy and working toward a Just Transition.

#### **POOR Magazine**

\$50,000

POOR Magazine is a grassroots, non-profit arts organization dedicated to media access, art, education, and advocacy for people in poverty. Key projects include Stolen Land/Hoarded Resource UnTours to demand reparations and radical wealth redistribution and using PeopleSkool to educate people with privilege about the legacies of colonization, trauma, and how to take action for redistribution and land protection.

#### **Power Shift Network (PSN)**

\$100,000

Power Shift Network mobilizes the collective power of young people working to combat climate and environmental injustice, stop dirty energy projects, divest from fossil fuels, fix democracy, and build the just, clean-energy powered future young people need.

#### ¡Que Paguen!

\$15,000

¡Que Paguen! is a coalition of organizations and activists throughout Argentina, Bolivia,

Chile, Ecuador, Brazil, Colombia,
Dominican Republic, Guatemala, and Peru
fighting against extractivism and all its
forms. WDN's grant supports the creation
of a short documentary featuring
indigenous communities' resistance and
struggles against extractivism across Latin
American territories. The film will be shown
at policy forums, film festivals, and climate
justice weeks to help move resources and
advance policy change.

#### Sogorea Te' Land Trust

\$100,000

Sogorea Te' is an urban Indigenous women-led land trust that facilitates the return of Indigenous land to Indigenous people through the practices of rematriation, cultural revitalization, and land restoration. Sogorea Te' calls on native and non-native peoples to heal and transform the legacies of colonization, genocide, and patriarchy.
